ENDNOTES:

¹"Network" refers to a specified group of physicians, hospitals, medial clinics and other health care providers that your plan may require you to use in order to get any coverage at all under the plan, or that the plan may encourage you to use because it pays more of your bill if you use their network providers (i.e., go in-network) than if you don't (i.e., go out-of-network).

²"Deductible Type" indicates whether the deductible period is "Calendar Year" (January 1 through December 31) or "Benefit Year" (i.e., based on a benefit year beginning on the policy's anniversary date) or if the deductible is based on other requirements such as "Per Accident or Injury" or "Per Confinement".

^{2a}"Deductible" means the amount you will have to pay for allowable covered expenses under a health plan during a specified time period (e.g., a calendar year or benefit year) before the carrier will cover those expenses. The specific expenses that are subject to deductible may vary by policy. Expenses that are subject to deductible may be noted in boxes 8 through 31.

^{2b}"Individual" means the deductible amount you and each individual covered by a non-HSA qualified policy will have to pay for allowable covered expenses before the carrier will cover those expenses. "Single" means the deductible amount you will have to pay for allowable covered expenses under an HSA-qualified plan when you are the only individual covered by the plan.

⁵ Well-baby care includes an in-hospital newborn pediatric visit and newborn hearing screening. The hospital copayment applies to mother and well-baby together; they are not separate copayments.

⁶ Prescription drugs otherwise excluded are not covered, regardless of whether preferred generic, preferred brand name or non-preferred.

⁷ "Emergency care" means services delivered by an emergency care facility which are necessary to screen and stabilize a covered person. The plan must cover this care if a prudent layperson having average knowledge of health services and medicine and acting reasonably would have believed that an emergency medical condition or life or limb threatening emergency existed.

⁸ Non-emergency care delivered in an emergency room is covered only if the covered person receiving such care was referred to the emergency room by his/her carrier or primary care physician. If emergency departments are used by the plan for non-emergency after-hours care, than urgent care copayments apply.

⁹ "Biologically based mental illnesses" means schizophrenia, schizoaffective disorder, bipolar affective disorder, major depressive disorder, specific obsessive-compulsive disorder and panic disorder.

¹⁰ Waiver of pre-existing conditions exclusions. State law requires carriers to waive some or all of the pre-existing conditions exclusion period based on other coverage you recently may have had. Ask your carrier or plan sponsor (e.g., employer) for details.

¹¹ Grievances. Colorado law requires all plans to use grievance procedures. Write the Colorado Division of Insurance for a copy of those procedures.

This is to provide notice as required under recent federal law (the Women's Health and Cancer Rights Act, effective October 21, 1998).

Under this health plan, coverage will be provided to a member who is receiving benefits for a medically necessary mastectomy and who elects breast reconstruction after the mastectomy for:

- 1) reconstruction of the breast on which a mastectomy has been performed;
- 2) surgery and reconstruction of the other breast to produce a symmetrical appearance;
- 3) prostheses; and
- 4) treatment of physical complications of all stages of mastectomy, including lymph-edemas.

This coverage will be provided in consultation with the attending physician and the patient, and will be subject to the same annual deductible and coinsurance provisions that apply for the mastectomy.

EXCLUSIONS

This plan does not cover all health care expenses and includes exclusions and limitations. Members should refer to their plan documents to determine which health care services are covered and to what extent. The following is a partial list services and supplies that are generally *not covered*. However, your plan documents may contain exceptions to this list based on state mandates or the plan design or rider(s) purchased by your employer.

All medical or hospital services not specifically covered in, or which are limited or excluded on the plan documents, including costs of services before coverage begins and after coverage terminates; Charges related to any eye surgery mainly to correct refractive errors; Cosmetic surgery, including breast reduction; Custodial care; Dental care and X-rays; Donor egg retrieval; Experimental and investigational procedures; Hearing aids; Home births;

Immunization for travel or work; Implantable drugs and certain injectable drugs, including injectable infertility drugs; Infertility services, including, but not limited to artificial insemination and advanced reproductive technologies such as IVF, ZIFT, GIFT, ICSA and other related services, unless specifically listed as covered in your plan documents; Non-medically necessary services or supplies; Orthotics, unless specified in the plan; Over-the-counter medications and supplies; Radial keratotomy or related procedures; Reversal of sterilization; Services for the treatment of sexual dysfunction or inadequacies, including therapy, supplies, or counseling; Special duty nursing; Therapy or rehabilitation other than those listed as covered in the plan documents; and Treatment of those services for or related to treatments of obesity or for diet or weight control.

They may also be subject to precertification or step-therapy. non-prescription drugs and drugs in the Limitations and Exclusions section of the plan documents (received after enrollment) are not covered, and medical exceptions are not available for them.
